New Business: Cathy Ptak, Clerk presented a PA 116 application for a parcel at Geerlings Hillside Farms, L.L. C. A motion by Ptak, supported by McKellips to approve Geerlings Hillside Farms, L.L.C., PA 116 Application for a parcel in Section 29 and Section 30 PPNs: 03-04-029-005-00, 03-04-029-007-00 and 03-04-030-001-00. This PA 116 will be sent to the Planning Commission and the Allegan Conservation District for approval.

Fire Chief McKellips submitted the Clyde Township Fire Department year-end report. There were 116 incidents from 01/01/2019 through 12/31/2019.

Don Nagel of the Ambulance Board reported there will be a 1 year extension concerning rates with AMR. After August 1<sup>st</sup> rates will go up . There was some discussion regarding the rate increase and what the bid from LIFE is. The Township will need to know rates and which jurisdictions will be included in this bid to determine if and how much of an increase a mileage renewal will need to be which will be placed on the Nov. 2020 ballot.

Bernie McLeod of the Transfer Station reported he was asked if used insulin needles can be thrown in the landfill. McLeod asked the Health Dept. and asked for a container to be used. The response from the Health Dept. was to have people put the needles in a soap bottle and label – Do Not Use. Then tape and go ahead and throw in the landfill.
